Association members visit to Live-Fire Ex Kapyong, Waiouru.

On the weekend of August 3/4, 16 Fd Regt and 163 Bty once again generously invited members of the Assoc to join them on the gun line at Waiouru for a day to observe the Bty's 105mm guns live-firing during Ex. Kapyong, and then hosted us in the WOs/SNCOs mess, with accommodation in four man rooms in Faenza barracks, and meals in the 800 man mess.

The weather forecast was for what we all expect of Waiouru in mid-winter, cold and windy with sometimes sleety heavy showers, and it was most of that, with snow arriving soon after we left on Sunday.

We were generously hosted on our visit by the RSM 16 Fd Regt, WO1 Heath Southcombe, who met us on Friday night to settle us into our barracks, got us to dinner, and welcomed us to the WOs/SNCOs mess. On Sat morning we met the RSM and his transport crew to begin our day with 163 Bty, going out into the field in heavy rain in Pinzgauer vehicles. Our heavy weather clothing (nothing to do with ageing limbs of course) made for some interesting slow motion entries to and exits from the Pinzgauer vehicles.

It was cold with sleety showers on and off all day, but that didn't dampen enthusiasm and it was great to be back with the guns and gunners at a gun position not familiar to most of us near the southern edge of the training area on the Tarn track, about 7 km from camp. After a safety briefing from the GPO and being kitted out with double hearing protection we joined the gunners to observe the Bty fire missions in support of an officer cadet school exercise, with great opportunities for us to join the gun crews on the guns and to watch the command post in action. During the day we were warmed up with a very good hotbox lunch, and hot cuppas generously supplied by the gun crews. The guns were firing at target areas about 8 km from gun position on charge 6, so there was plenty of noise, recoil, and concussion from the guns. Working the guns alongside the 163 Bty RF gunners were several Army Reserve gunners and a subaltern from 11/4 Bty in Auckland.

After the firing was over for the day we were taken back to camp in the afternoon the long way round, including a fascinating stop to inspect the shell cratered fall of shot area in front of the thick walled/roofed Close Target Observation Post (CTOP) with its shell fragment proof window, before coming back to camp via Home Valley.

Back at camp after dinner we gathered for drinks in the WOs/SNCOs mess, which we shared with the Army Reserve (TF) senior NCO course and the Wellington Lions Rugby team. As always when gunners gather there were plenty of stories told by all ages, from Korea/Vietnam veteran Les Pye down to our younger association members.

After breakfast on Sunday in the 800 man mess the museum's Grant Hays gave us a great tour of the Army museum's collection of many guns that members of the association have been helping the museum restore under our "Op Ubiquitous" banner over the last couple of years, before we all headed home, keen to beat the snow which arrived later that day and closed the desert road.

Many thanks to the CO and personnel of 16 Fd Regt, in particular to our host RSM Southcombe, to all in 163 Bty, and to the Waiouru WOs/SNCOs mess for a wonderful opportunity and their warm hospitality, once again hosting association members on a live fire exercise and in camp. Also thanks to the Assoc Secretary Chris Pearce and President Tony McLeod for setting up/organising the visit for the rest of us. The ability for members to attend these live fire exercises each year is greatly appreciated and valued enormously by the association, and by those who attend.

Always out and Seldom Inn.....



161 Bty—early on in deployment

A recent conversation re the Seldom Inn...

You asked me what I know of the origin of 161 Bty's all-ranks mess pub sign "The Seldom Inn". Well, I was personally involved in its production. The idea arose from conversations in the mess, I think between the BSM and BQMS, SSGT Black. Anyway it reflected the feelings in the Battery at the time that..... "we are always out on deployment supporting the Americans or Aussies, and we are **seldom in**".

I was attached to the Bty from November 65 to Apr 66. It was a 'convenient attachment' as I was actually flying HUEYs with CoA, 82nd Airborne aviation company. Wally Steward, another NZACC pilot, was also attached but we both enjoyed the privileges of the Bty mess. (The US Army had no similar mess arrangements at this time and we were, I think, somewhat envied). Having a drink one day I overheard the idea of the a pub sign for the mess being discussed.

I was due a week's leave in Malaysia and thought it would be a good idea to have a sign made there, and so it happened. It was made to order by a Malaysian sign writer near Terendak.

This photo is of Wally Steward and Graeme Black standing under the sign outside the mess in late Dec 65/early Jan 66. After this the Bty moved to Nui Dat to join the Aussie base and the sign went with it. Eventually returning to NZ with John Master's Bty in 1972, it was in Papakura and is now hung at the lines in Linton—Roger Pearce



Mystery Artist Discovered?.....



Following on from the last exciting instalment in the previous newsletter, it would appear we may have uncovered the identity of the unknown artist of Faenza.

As the reader will recall, Brig Les Wright recalled an artist by the name of Grippen who was a Tech Ack at HQ Divisional Artillery, HQ 2NZEF. When I circulated this information to the tour group, the tour guide Mr Renee Wilson enquired whether the name might be Crippen, as he recalled an art teacher at Auckland Grammar School in the 60's by the name of Crippen (Renee's vague recollection was that he may have been 'a soldier in the war'). Les Wright confirmed that the man's name was more likely to have been Crippen and so a quick Google search revealed a Mr Jack Crippen, who had not only taught art at Auckland Grammar for 28 years, had been on the staff at HQ Divisional Artillery during WW2, but had also been an unofficial war artist whose work has all been recorded and digitised by the NZ Archivist. This has to be the mystery artist, even if the nature of these sketches, pin-up models, doesn't seem to have been the topic of any of his other paintings. *(Please google Mr Jack W Crippen for more biographical detail and photos of his art work).*

So I have notified the owner's of Villa Archi in Faenza of the news, as any NZ tourist who may be following in the footsteps of a relative who fought in the Italian campaign would I am sure be delighted to visit, and possibly stay, at a place where the HQ NZ Divisional Artillery spent the winter of 1944/45.

I also notified the NZ Archivist of the discovery, and enquired whether they may be interested in recording and digitising these genuine pieces of NZ War Art. I am awaiting a reply from them.

Enquiries are also continuing as to whether Jack (who died in 1985) has any living relatives who may be interested in the discovery of the paintings.

Enclosed is a form which veterans or their families can complete and forward to Auckland Museum electronically or by post to contribute details to this resource.

The website's details are on the form along with contact details. Its well worth having a look at the website and going in to the on-line cenotaph. The museum is undergoing major refurbishment at the moment however the war galleries are largely unaffected.

In particular, the online resource does not have as much information as it would like on Malaya and Vietnam. If any members (and their families) can contribute to this resource it would be hugely beneficial, and in many cases an enlightening process.
