Sir Arthur Nevill writes in thanking us for his election to Life Membership, and says that he had been asked recently, "What happened to the Gun which was removed from the Gun Pit to provide the final resting place for Bill Massey, in 1925. I had happened to mention that I was present at Bill Massey's funeral, concerned as a member of a repository squad from Fort Dorset in removing the 6 inch E.O.C. Gun at Point Halswell in a great hurry as Bill Massey was dying. We just got it out in time as the Funeral Procession was on its way. Perhaps some member of the RNZA may remember it. Master Gunner Weybourne and Capt Ivory were there also I was a mere Lt. RNZA at that time".

Sir Arthur subsequently transferred some years later with the rank of Capt, (all pre-1939 Gunners will remember that any rank was long and far between in those days). Went on to a distinguished Air Force career and retired as Air Vice Marshall, Chief of Air Staff, still keeping a close contact with our Assn.

Frank Cherry writes of the old days in the deep South at Matarea, prior to the move to Sutton where TF Camps were held. Away in "Central" and L of C being long - not much fresh grub - had to get there by train and horse wagon, so QM relied on corned beef - breakfast, lunch, and dinner. TF being in camp for a week or ten days - RF eight weeks.

Finally the breaking Camp day came, and "Big Jim" or "Kewpie" - known under either name - asked a certain humerous Bdr, "Did" by nameto send a telegram for him. When Kewpie got home, throwing his pack savagely on the hall floor, he was served a large plateful of corned

beef.
