6. "APPRECIATIONS" ::

457585 Malcom Charles NABBS, MBE,

"Mac" as he was affectionally known to his many friends, joined the RNZA in 1951. He soon made his mark in the Regiment, being promoted Lbdr before the end of his first year. Thereafter his efficiency and devotion to duty saw his rapid progression through the non-commissioned ranks as an instructor, including three years at School of Artillery from 1958-61.

Promoted W62 in 1964, he served for a short time as BSM, 4 Med Bty before being posted overseas as BSM 161 Bty in Vietnam.

Appreciations : Major M.C. Nabbs :

As a result of his Service there he achieved the very rare distinction of being awarded the MBE on Active Service.

Returning to NZ in 1966, he was promoted WO1 and posted to School of Artillery as Master Gunner until 1969.

Posted Chief Clerk, at Directorate RNZA in 1970 in which year he was Commissioned. Various Staff Appointments followed, S.O.Manning, GSO2 RNZA, Promoted Temp.Major in 1974, Sub.Major in 1981.

His final appt. was DAQMG (Works) at Landforce HQ. Takapuna.

He underwent major surgery in May '83, and after recovery went back to work, but had to retire in Jan 84; he bravely lingered on until May '84. This long suffering is reflected in the words of someone who wrote of him, "Throughout his careerMac never failed to present a cheerful outlook no matter how dismal the circumstances; thus he was an inspiration to others including those of equal rank".

1496. George Harold SALT, MRE,

George Enlisted in NZ. Army in 1917, at the age of 14 yrs, and was posted to Featherston Camp as a Trumpeter Boy. After two years he became redundant at the end of the War in 1919.

He Enlisted in Royal NZ.Artillery in 1923, being posted as a Field Artillery Driver, his stories of the horses and their names at that time were legion; at the old Alexandra Barracks in Buckle St. (The present site of the Carillon and National Museum Wellington.

He served there for some years, then posted to Narrow Neck Camp, Auckland

still with Field Arty.

In the mid-1930s he transferred to Coast Arty and was intimately concerned

with the installation of 6in Mk XXI on Motutapu Island.

During the 1939-55 War years he was engaged in Coastal Mountings in the Pacific, mainly in Fiji, and in Tonga. Returning to NZ. he was again actively engaged in mounting 6in P.5. Naval Mountings in numerous places around the NZ coast; Whangaroa, Makara, Nelson, Oamaru, and Dunedin, to name a few.

Later he was concerned with the mounting of 6in Mk XXIV's at Godley Head, Lyttleton, and back in Auckland the completion and proofing of the 9.2in installations at Whangaparaoa and Waiheke Island.

These experiences naturally made him one of the leading experts of the

time in Coast Artillery Installations.
He finished his Service as CO 9 Coast Regt in the interim period after

the War, and Retired in 1948. He was universally known as an amazing raconteur, recalling people and places with great wit, even the smallest incidents throughout his life, things you and I would have forgetten years ago.
